



An invitation to join the James Lind Alliance (JLA) Priority Setting Partnership (PSP) about Alcohol-Related Liver Disease

We would like to invite you to become a partner in the JLA PSP in Alcohol-Related Liver Disease, to help us find out what research would make a difference to patients, carers and health professionals.

What is the JLA PSP?

The James Lind Alliance (JLA) is a non-profit making initiative bringing patients, carers and clinicians together in Priority Setting Partnerships (PSPs). These partnerships identify and prioritise uncertainties, or 'unanswered questions', about the effects of treatments.

The JLA has formed a PSP into Alcohol-Related Liver Disease that is being funded by the National Institute for Health Research and the British Society of Gastroenterology. The aim is to identify unanswered questions about alcohol-related liver disease interventions, to form a list of top ten questions for researchers to answer. This process will help ensure that research into clinical practice and services identifies and addresses the questions that are of most importance to those affected by the condition.

What are we asking you to do?

By becoming a partner you will be kept informed about the PSP and you can show your support by:

- completing the survey yourself at www.psp.nihr.ac.uk/alcohol-related-liver-disease/survey
- adding the survey link to your website
- circulating the survey (or a link to the survey) by email or other channels to encourage patients, carers, colleagues and support networks to complete it
- tweeting about the survey using #ARLDPSP being sure to link to the survey in the tweet
- keeping in touch with the project so that you can be invited to help in the next stage of prioritising the questions that are received. Whether you have taken part in the first survey or not, you can still help us by voting on which of the questions raised should be a priority.
